Temple Bat Yam

Temple Bat Yam was founded in April, 1985, by families who felt the need to establish a Jewish presence in East Fort Lauderdale. The Temple is affiliated with the Union for Reform Judaism, the national congregational body of the Reform Movement, and with the World Union for Progressive Judaism. The Temple facility was acquired in 1987. Sanctuary, Social Hall and Library renovations, including the installation of our Sanctuary's award winning Hart Windows, were completed in 2006.

Rabbi Lewis C. Littman, D.D., has served Temple Bat Yam continuously since his election in 1986. Cantor Wendy Autenrieth, M.S.M, and Educational Director Arnold Bergman complete our professional staff. All are graduates of Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion. They are joined by a committed Board and active committees, as well as Sisterhood, Brotherhood, Club '50', Youth Group and Caring Community, all of which provide opportunities for service and relationships.

Shabbat services are conducted at 8:00 p.m., each Friday and each Saturday at 10:30 a.m. Family services which encourage the participation of our younger children are conducted one Friday each month at 7:30 p.m. Services are also conducted for the Holy Days and Festivals of the Jewish year, and periodically for *Havdalah* on the beach or on the Temple patio. Our participatory worship is a blend of Hebrew and English, utilizing *Mishkan Tefilah*, the newly published prayer book of Reform Judaism. Services are often enriched by the participation of the Temple's Inter-generational band, *Dor L'dor*, and our youth and adult choirs.

The Sy and Susan Sperling School of Jewish Education at Temple Bat Yam provides education in Jewish history, traditions, prayers, values and Hebrew from Pre-Kindergarten through Confirmation in grade 10. Post-Confirmation classes are also offered. Religious School classes meet each Sunday morning from 10:00 a.m. - 12 noon for children from pre-school to grade ten. Students in grades three through seven also attend classes on Tuesday afternoon from 4:15 p.m. - 6:15 p.m. Pre-Bar and Bat Mitzvah students study directly with the Cantor and the Rabbi in preparation for this milestone event. Regular Family Education experiences are scheduled throughout the school during the year.

Kids Learning Academy at Temple Bat Yam, open Monday through Friday, enrolls children from 1 through 5 years. A flexible schedule of days and hours is offered. The Preschool also provides extended care and afternoon enrichments. The Preschool offers a close association with our congregation and our Rabbi and Cantor.

A variety of adult education classes taught by the Rabbi, Cantor and Educational Director offers multiple opportunities for continuing study. Among these offerings is an annual Introduction to Judaism course which meets on Sunday mornings, Tuesday morning study of classical Jewish sources, Hebrew and Comparative Religion courses for adults, and Jewish Music. The Temple is a campus of the internationally acclaimed Florence Melton Adult Mini School. An annual series of Book Reviews by the Rabbi, and guest speakers, supplement the Adult Education program. Torah study is also an integral part of our Shabbat worship. Our youth and adults are also involved in Social Action projects in the general community, enabling us to fulfill the mitzvot of *tzedakah* and *G'millut Chasadim* (justice and deeds of kindness).

As a congregational family - a mishpachah - we share grief and joy, hard work and a sense of accomplishment. The 360 households of Temple Bat Yam continue to develop a community that encompasses unified goals, deep loyalties, unbridled energy and an unshakable spirit. We invite you to join us, and to share in our efforts.

Established in 1965, Temple Beth Israel was the 1st Conservative Synagogue in Fort Lauderdale, Florida. Over 200 families participate in worship, education and all social activities of our synagogue. As a welcoming conservative egalitarian synagogue, we encourage active participation in our services and activities. All Jewish festivals are celebrated and Shabbat is a special moment each and every week. On Friday nights we gather to welcome Shabbat. On Saturday morning we continue our Shabbat service with a study of the Parashah of the week. The last Shabbat of each month, there is a dinner following services. Our ritual services continue every Monday and Thursday morning for Minyan followed by a study session and breakfast with Rabbi Marcelo Bater. During the week there are different activities for all ages: Singing Chaverim for children up to 5 years of age, Al Galgalim (Training Wheels) sponsored by Hadassah for families with children ages 3-6. This 2 hour session is filled with crafts, songs, snacks and parenting discussions. Adult Education programs are also an important goal in our temple- Shabbat Lunch

& Learn lecture series, Rosh Chodesh group for women, Havdallah Movie nights and various social action projects. We are working very hard to fulfill what our tradition teaches us. Rabbi Tarfon used to say “ You are not required to complete the task, yet you are not free to withdraw from it.....”(Pirkei Avot 2:21)
