

Caring for the Elderly & Dire Needs - \$1,313,822

We strive to assure that seniors age with dignity and that all human needs for Jews of all ages are met.

Priority Funding

- Respite and/or day care programs
- Caregiver support
- Greater accessibility to services
- Assisting families with preschool aged children who are in financial distress

■ Gemilut Hasadim - \$300,000

Emergency financial assistance to help families in crisis pay for rent, mortgages, utility bills and medicine, administered by Goodman Jewish Family Services.

■ Living Room Program - \$20,000

A transitional program for seniors who are less independent but not yet ready for the Adult Day Care program at Daniel D. Cantor Senior Center.

■ Indigent Seniors - \$165,000

Financial and emergency assistance for seniors who are in crisis, administered by Goodman Jewish Family Services.

■ Soref Preschool Scholarships - \$131,500

Scholarships to help families in financial need so their children can attend Soref Jewish Community Center preschool.

■ Posnack Preschool Scholarships - \$104,500

Scholarships to help families in financial need so their children can attend David Posnack Jewish Community Center preschool and preschool camp.

■ Adult Day Care - \$70,000

The Daniel D. Cantor Senior Center provides a safe, secure day care for seniors who are afflicted with Alzheimer's Disease or other memory disorders as well as a refuge for caregivers.

■ Counseling - \$70,000

Therapeutic help for individuals and/or families in crisis.

■ Senior Center Programs - \$65,000

Enables seniors to participate in the programs provided by The Daniel D. Cantor Senior Center.

■ Group Home Care Food Program - \$55,275

Meals for children living in the group home at Jewish Adoption & Foster Care Options, Inc. (JAFCO) children's village.

■ Synagogues Preschool Scholarships - \$40,000

Scholarships to help families in financial need so their children can attend a synagogue preschool.

■ Broward Meals on Wheels - \$34,000

Delivers Kosher meals to homebound seniors.

■ Reserve for Emergency Needs - \$29,697

Resources set aside for financial needs that may arise from an emergency situation, such as a hurricane.

■ Soref JCC WECARE Food Pantry - \$77,000

Provides families and individuals in financial need with non-perishable food items.

■ Summer Camp Scholarships - \$25,000

Scholarships to help clients of Goodman Jewish Family Services afford day camp so they can maintain employment during the summer.

■ Passover Food Distribution - \$25,000

A collaborative program between Federation, Soref Jewish Community Center and Goodman Jewish Family Services to enable seniors and needy families to obtain holiday food items.

■ Family Jewish Engagement Post Preschool - \$25,000

The Jewish Identity Impact Team will develop initiatives to increase the number of families choosing to continue their child in a Jewish engagement program, such as a synagogue school, synagogue membership, Jewish day school, Jewish youth program or Jewish camp.

■ Soref JCC Summer Camp Scholarships - \$21,000

Scholarships to help families in financial need provide a safe environment during the summer months so they can work. The camp is the continuation of Soref JCC preschool, which is a 10-month program.

■ Joint Agency Scholarship Fund - \$20,000

Provides families in need with financial assistance so they can afford to send their children to a program under the auspices of a synagogue or JCC.

■ Indigent Burials - \$12,500

Provide Jewish burial for individuals who have no resources to pay for funeral services.

■ Impact Broward - \$12,000

In-home care for seniors with Alzheimer's Disease or dementia. Also, provides respite to their elderly caregivers.

■ Caregiver Support Group - \$6,350

A collaborative program between David Posnack Jewish Community Center and Goodman Jewish Family Services to provide a support group for caregivers of older adults.

■ Kolot - \$5,000

Counseling and emergency services for victims of domestic abuse, a program of Goodman Jewish Family Services.

WHAT YOUR DOLLAR\$ SUPPORT

Our mission is to enable a Jewish community that connects people, ensures a Jewish future and cares for Jews in Broward County, in Israel and around the world. We do this by supporting programs provided by a community-wide network.

Strategic Funding leverages our collaborative human and financial resources to create a maximum impact. By combining the revenue streams from the Annual Campaign, Designated Funds, and the Jewish Community Foundation's Unrestricted Funds, Restricted Special Purpose Funds, ACE and LOJE Endowments, and Philanthropic Funds, approximately \$9,097,000 will be pumped into life-transforming services during the 2016-2017 fiscal year.

Embracing Special Needs - \$281,410

We strive to provide Jews with disabilities equal opportunity and education that promotes learning with personal growth.

Priority Funding

- Enable individuals with special needs to live in dignity
- Inclusion: To fully participate in Jewish life
- Provide assistance and support to families
- Innovative social activities, especially for adults

■ Joshua's Path - \$150,000

Goodman Jewish Family Services, in collaboration with the Federation, provides information and referrals to help families access services and plan for the needs of their adult children who have developmental and physical disabilities as well as mental illness.

■ Giborim Scholarships - \$50,000

Financial assistance to help families send their child with special needs to summer camp at David Posnack Jewish Community Center.

■ Special Needs Education - \$37,500

Scholarship assistance for children in grades K-12, enabling them to have a Jewish day school experience at South Florida Jewish Academy.

■ Friendship Circle* - \$20,000

Pairs teenage volunteers with children who have special needs for social and enrichment activities as well as family respite care. This allocation is expanded from last year to include programs in both South and North Broward County through Chabad.

■ Kulam* - \$12,500

Enables students with mild-to-moderate learning disability to be in a day school setting. The total Federation support for this program is \$25,000, with the balance being funded from a distribution made by the Jewish Identity Impact Team.

■ Recreational and Educational Start-Up Fund - \$11,410

Funding available for proposals that create opportunities for adults with special needs to participate in mainstream social, cultural, recreational and fitness programs offered by the Jewish community.

Community Support - \$5,666,307

■ Program Services - projected \$2,018,586

The Jewish Federation of Broward County is about strengthening and enabling community. We do this through direct service programs such as Chai Care; through strategic impact centers where we plan for the needs of the community; with engagement programs and through assistance programs such as mortgage payments made on behalf of several agency related properties.

■ Special Purpose Funds - \$304,987

The Jewish Federation of Broward County is about sustainability and purpose. Several named endowment funds make disbursements to beneficiary agencies and impact programs in support of communal initiatives such as immersive Israel experiences, aging, and special need services.

■ Philanthropic Fund Disbursements - projected \$1,000,000

The Jewish Community Foundation works with donors to be their Center for Philanthropy. Fund holders make recommendations to a host of valid charitable organizations – Jewish and Secular, local and global. ■ Federation Management and Fundraising Services - \$2,342,734

The Jewish Federation allocates resources that provide planning for critical community services and assists in building a strong Jewish community for the future. Management services include property oversight, community security, planning, allocation oversight, leadership development, accounting and grant assistance. Fundraising services are all aspects of the Federations operations that go into raising funds.



Fostering Jewish Identity - \$770,862

We strive to assure that Jews of all ages can experience a connection to Judaism and identify with our rich heritage.

Priority Funding

- Jewish overnight summer camp
- Israel experiences
- Day schools
- Teen informal education

■ Day School Support - \$250,000

Support for students attending Brauser Maimonides Academy, David Posnack Jewish Day School, Hebrew Academy Community School of Margate and Temple Beth Emet Day School.

■ Overnight Summer Camp - \$73,810

Grants to help send any first-time camper to a Jewish overnight summer camp, approved by One Happy Camper Foundation. In addition, need-based scholarships are also available for qualifying applicants.

■ March of the Living - \$57,200

Passes the torch of Holocaust memory to future generations by bringing together teens and Holocaust survivors to commemorate the death march by marching from Auschwitz to Birkenau on Yom HaShoah (Holocaust Memorial Day) and then onto Israel to celebrate Yom HaAtzmaut (Independence Day).

■ Center for Excellence - \$50,000

Provides leadership to raise the quality of Jewish education across all platforms: congregational education, early childhood education and Jewish day school education. Orloff Central Agency for Jewish Education will host professional learning opportunities to include conferences, seminars and web based learning opportunities.

■ Peer Engagement Programming - \$35,000

Cultivates relationships and engagement opportunities for Jewish students attending one of Broward County's colleges or universities through programs hosted by Hillel of Broward and Palm Beach.

■ Alexander Muss High School in Israel* - \$35,000

Scholarships for Broward County students to participate in Alexander Muss High School in Israel. A program for students to study abroad and connect to their heritage.

■ PJ Library®* - \$103,572

Funding for community-based programs (targeting families with young children) in public spaces throughout Broward County.

■ Jewish Student Union \$20,280

Enables Jewish teens attending public and secular schools to foster a strong Jewish identity through extracurricular club activities.

■ Israel Engagement Fellow- \$20,000

Students attending one of Broward County's colleges or universities will strengthen their ties to Israel through cultural and educational programs, hosted by Hillel of Broward and Palm Beach.

■ Student Awareness Seminars - \$20,000

Holocaust education for students, primarily attending public schools. Holocaust Documentation and Education Center hosts Holocaust survivors to share their memories.

■ Maccabi Tzair - \$20,000

Connecting Latin Jews to strengthen their Jewish identity and connection to Israel through innovative programs, hosted by David Posnack Jewish Community Center.

■ Synagogue School Support - \$19,000

Engaging students, many who attend public schools, in Jewish learning through educational classes at area synagogues, including: Congregation B'nai Aviv, Congregation Kol Tikvah, Ramat Shalom, Temple Bat Yam, Temple Beth Am, Temple Beth El, Temple Beth Emet, Temple Beth Israel, Temple Beth Orr, Temple Beth Torah Sha'aray Tzedek, Temple Dor Dorim, Temple Kol Ami Emanu-El, Temple Sinai of Hollywood and Temple Solel.

■ Leadership Programs, Continuity and Enhancement - \$15,000

Programs guiding our future leaders to further connect with Jewish life and identity, promoting continued involvement into adulthood. Administered by BBYO.

■ Judaica High, Teen Engagement - \$15,000

Teen peer groups connecting teens through Jewish life, learning, volunteerism and friendship.

■ Kulam* - \$12,500

Enables students with mild-to-moderate learning disabilities to excel in a day school setting. The total Federation support for this program is \$25,000, with the balance being funded from a distribution made by the Special Needs Impact Team.

■ Jewish on Campus College Tours* - \$10,000

Preparing high school students for Jewish life in college with an emphasis on dealing with the BDS (boycott, divestment and sanctions) movement on campus.

■ Teen Clearinghouse - \$9,500

A resource for families to discover the engagement opportunities and programs for teenagers who want a connection to Judaism/Jewish life.

■ Israel Awareness Month - \$5,000

Introduces students attending one of Broward County's colleges or universities to the history, culture and vibrancy of Israel through a variety of programs, hosted by Hillel of Broward and Palm Beach.

Supporting Israel and Overseas - \$1,064,349

We strive to energize our bonds with Israel, renew Jewish life around the world and rescue the imperiled from at-risk communities.

Priority Funding

■ JFNA (Jewish Federations of North America) - \$701,353

Supports programs in Israel and in more than 75 countries around the world through our overseas partners — American-Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, Jewish Agency for Israel and World ORT.

■ Neshet: Broward Partnership - \$92,000

Our Federation has fostered a partnership with the City of Neshet through Partnership2gether for more than 10 years — creating a living bridge between our spiritual homeland and Broward County.

■ Pre-IDF Lone Soldiers in France and Ukraine - \$25,000

Helps olim have a smooth transition to the IDF and to begin their life in Israel as empowered, self-sufficient citizens.

■ Alma: Pre-Army Academy for Female Leadership - \$20,000

In partnership with the Jewish Women's Foundation to support a short-term, low-cost pre-army academy to prepare women in Israel for meaningful army service.

■ ELI: Working with Sexually Abused Soldiers - \$20,000

Provides therapeutic services to soldiers who are victims of sexual abuse as well as intensive training to officers on the ground who are responsible for these soldiers.

■ Yashar LaChayal – Warm Winter Campaign - \$20,000

Provides soldiers in the IDF with essential winter garments, including fleece jackets, neck warmers, hats, gloves and thermal undergarments.

■ Homebound Activities for Supportive Communities - \$19,600

Enables the elderly to combat isolation through engagement activities and programs.

■ Leket: Sandwiches for Kids - \$17,758

Feeds disadvantaged students who attend two schools in Neshet, enabling them to maximize their learning potential.

■ Reserve - \$23,859

■ Neshet: Youth At-Risk* - \$16,300

Students from Haifa University and the Technion serve as mentors to at-risk teens.

■ Summer Camp in Dnepropetrovsk - \$15,000

A Jewish summer camp experience for children from the former Soviet Union who have been denied a Jewish identity for years. For many of them, this is either their first or only opportunity to connect to any type of Jewish life and tradition.

■ Ethiopian-Israeli Education Scholarships - \$15,000

Provides free tuition, a monthly stipend, unlimited tutoring and a laptop computer at the Interdisciplinary Center Herzilya for Ethiopian-Israelis who have completed their army service.

■ Israel Elwyn* - \$12,500

Supporting service for people with disabilities who want to volunteer for National Service in lieu of the IDF.

■ Neshet: Acharai - \$12,500

A pre-army service program that enables volunteers to better prepare for the IDF service by spending one year working with at-risk youth, people with disabilities, the frail elderly and animals.

■ Dental Volunteers for Israel - \$10,627

Free dental care for children whose parents are serving in the IDF.

■ Be'er Sova: Nutritional Security - \$7,000

A community restaurant feeds hot lunches to the needy and at-risk youth. Meals are also delivered to homebound seniors.

■ Neshet: Warm a Soldier's Heart - \$6,250

Provides a support service and essential needs for disadvantaged soldiers from Neshet who are serving in the IDF.

■ Neshet: Ethiopian Pensioners Empowerment* - \$6,200

Enrichment programs that help Ethiopian-Israelis assimilate and feel more connected to their community.

■ Reut Sderot: Remedial Instruction* - \$5,000

Remedial instruction for at-risk children who come from new immigrant families.

■ Reut Sderot: Summer Camp - \$5,000

Scholarships for children, mainly from disadvantaged families, to attend a four-week summer camp experience at locations that are protected from rocket attacks.

■ Neshet: Paths to Parenting* - \$5,000

Therapeutic treatment for families and their children who are in crisis.

■ Neshet: Partnership Apartment - \$5,000

A fully-furnished apartment in Neshet provides volunteers from Broward County a safe, secure place to stay while visiting our partnership city.

■ Neshet: Shairut Le'umi for Partnership - \$3,402

Provides an opportunity for those who are unable to serve in the IDF to volunteer in community projects.
